LIBRARY BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING AGENDA WEDNESDAY, MARCH 20, 2019

The Board met in regular session at the Spanish Springs Library, 7100A Pyramid Lake Highway, Sparks, NV 89436.

Chair Alderman called the meeting to order at 4:00 pm

1) ROLL CALL

2) PUBLIC COMMENT

None noted

3) APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES

a. APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM THE LIBRARY BOARD MEETING OF FEBRUARY 20, 2019

On motion by Trustee Marsh, seconded by Trustee Parkhill, motion with duly carried, the Board approved the meeting minutes from February 20, 2019. All in favor, none opposed.

4) OLD BUSINESS

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE APPROVAL FOR 1 OF 3 OPTIONS TO REVISE LIBRARY BOARD BYLAWS TO POTENTIALLY CHANGE THE FREQUENCY OF LIBRARY BOARD MEETINGS

Chair Alderman tabled this agenda item until the next meeting for attendance to include Trustee Stoess, who originated this agenda item, and to update the subject line and staff report to allow Board discussion without limiting to options as currently presented in this agenda item.

5) **NEW BUSINESS**

a. WASHOE COUNTY LIBRARY BUDGET REVIEW PRESENTATION FOR 2019-2020

Director Scott presented the Washoe County Library Fiscal Year 19/20 Budget Review PowerPoint as presented in the board packet.

Upon extensive questioning by the Board, Director Scott clarified the following:

GIFT FUND Clarifications:

- The balance in the Gift Funds is higher than average due to the Tacchino Trust balance. Tacchino funds must be fully expended by 2021.
- Gift Funds are separate from the General Budget, are not affected by the County fiscal year, and are carried over annually.

EXPANSION FUND Clarifications:

- The Library is requesting more funding from the Expansion Fund this year than years prior.
- There is some disparity in the language from the original initiative and Washoe County interpretation for how the Library can expend allocated funds.
- The Library System is aware that language for a new initiative will need to be clearer so that there is separation allowing for the Library to have more control of library expansion fund expenditures.
- Once the Expansion Fund initiative sunsets and (if not approved for the Library by voters), the fund will continue to grow as taxes are continued to be collected; however, the County (not the Library) will be able to determine who benefits from collected tax dollars.
- The second to last slide in the budget review breaks down a request to increase the expansion fund by \$124k for additional Library expenditures.

COUNTY BUDGET/CIP Clarifications:

- The County is cautious and the budget will remain the same as there are no changes in the tax base calculation.
- A new North Valleys Library has again been requested for the County CIP Budget with a recommendation for a bond vote in November of 2020 to build if approved.
 - Branch Manager Jonnica Bowen stated, as a point of information, that the County has land located near the current location and that a new North Valleys Library has been on the CIP list since 1990.
 - Director Scott explained the \$10 million estimate for a new North Valleys Library comes from the most recent facility study, and using South Valleys as footprint. The estimate includes anticipated inflation costs associated with construction.
- For County match of Tacchino Funds, the Library is only asking for carpet and paint
 to spruce up the Sparks and Northwest Reno Libraries. There has not been an
 amount assigned to this project through CIP at this time. Tacchino Funds will be
 used to update furniture and fixtures for the branches.
- The Sierra View lease does not expire for two (2) years. Although staff is finding it increasingly difficult to serve the community as a whole, due to restricting access to the mall for homeless patrons by mall management. There are enough politics behind the scenes that the Library would need to determine where the County stands on the possibility of relocating the Sierra View Library.

Board Discussion included requesting a comparison to regional or similar sized libraries for budget, salary and benefits costs in general.

6) **REPORTS**

a. SPANISH SPRINGS LIBRARY REPORT ON PROGRAMS, ACTIVITIES AND OPERATIONS

Branch Manager Jana MacMillan stated that she pulled the annual Spanish Springs report together from reports provided by the previous branch manager. She highlighted the following from the staff report provided in the packet:

- Biggest change at Spanish Springs in the last year is staff changeover and movement between branches.
- Facility improvements to include replacement of handicapped entrance mechanisms, updated lighting, new sign, and weatherproof book drop.

- Events: hosted diverse variety of events to include System-wide Idea Box Faire
- Java Lounge Services: kiosk style cafe run through State of Nevada's Services for the Blind has seen changeover in state representatives three times in the last year. Additionally, they sold more beverages in February 2019 than in any month in the last year.
- Civic Engagement knitting and crochet groups have contributed to many community events
- Staff Highlights: Spanish Springs staff assisted other branches and programs as needed in the last year
- Volunteer: Three (3)of the Spanish Springs Volunteers were recipients of the bronze level Presidential Volunteer Awards and the volunteer run Book Sale has brought in \$75,000 since 2007.
- Variety of community outreaches and news review article from August 2018.

She reported the following upcoming community involvement that was not provided in the written report:

- Spanish Springs is reaching out to the school staff at the new elementary school (Bohach) to be opened in 2020 and the new middle school (Sky Ranch) opening this year, and hiring for middle school staff will be taking place at Spanish Springs this week and next.
- Re-creating Spanish Spring Teen Zone and limiting adult access/pass through to other areas of the Library
- Scheduled a teen art event set up for July

Board Comments included:

- Glad to see the Library is still collaborating with native schools and customs
- Liked the format of the report, it was very readable

Upon questioning by the Board, Ms. MacMillan clarified the following:

- Her statement on the meeting room usage seeming to be busier than ever was supported by more constant use throughout the week; however, she does not have statistics yet to support the statement.
- There is a library team that works to ensure programming is reviewed and shared between branches and make sure all communities have access to similar programming.

Ms. MacMillan invited the Board to the Young Writers night next Tuesday (3/26/19) to hear some of the authors read excerpts from the book created this January.

Upon questioning by the Board, Director Scott:

- Confirmed that minutes are created from the branch manager meeting, not officially but more to provide follow up and they could be provided upon request.
- Invited Trustees (less than 3 at any given time to not create a quorum) to attend a
 Youth Services and Library Events (YSLE) meeting to better understand how
 programming is communicated at the Library level and shared in community
 programming.
- Clarified that programming throughout each library and system wide is immense
 and that the Library Director's reports have included bullets on programs in the
 branches as well as the system briefly as highlights to help prompt questions by the

Board and that he has always been willing to answer any questions during this report.

Trustee Holland agreed with Director Scott's suggestion of attending applicable library staff meetings if Trustees have questions about specific library operations or program logistics. Any pertinent information could then be shared with the Library Board at the next published meeting.

b. TACCHINO TRUST EXPENDITURE UPDATE

The Board reviewed the information submitted in the packet.

Director Scott stated that Downtown Reno Library is getting ready for the Opening Day Collection and purchasing of furniture in anticipation for the Grand Re-opening scheduled for May 17, 2019. He is hopeful this will ready by mid-April.

c. **BOARD TASK REPORT UPDATE**

The Board reviewed the information submitted in the packet.

9) **BOARD COMMENT**

Trustee Marsh thanked Director Scott for following through livestreaming TedX. She said she believed the calendar worked out well this year.

Trustee Holland thanked Director Scott for the time spent explaining how the expansion funds and taxation works in relation to the budget. He requested that Director Scott allow for similar discussion when the County budget and CIP requests are approved for the upcoming fiscal year.

Chair Alderman requested budget update and expansion discussion to be included on the May 2019 Agenda

DATE: April 17, 2019

Background: Washoe County Library System Board of Trustees have traditionally met once a month as is mandated by Library Board of Trustee Bylaws.

During the February 20, 2019 Board meeting, Trustee Stoess proposed a decrease in the number of monthly meetings to allow for more robust agendas and effective time management while decreasing cancellations or meeting reschedules for staff and Board members who attend Library Board of Trustee meetings.

In the last 5 years, Library Board meetings have been cancelled 6 times due to a light agenda or lack of quorum. Library Board meetings have been rescheduled twice in the last 5 years.

The Library has provided some ideas for discussion and potential approval of a meeting schedule that we think will meet everyone's needs. The months provided below the following ideas were selected for times that we would anticipate heavier agendas or required functions of the board. The Library wants to ensure major months where quarterly reports would be due as well as months we traditionally have scheduled items (for example, July is designated for a review of the bylaws and election of officers) are included in the meeting schedule.

Ideas for discussion include but are not limited to the following:

- Keep the monthly meeting schedule as is, but adding a revision to the Library Board Bylaws that includes the addition of an action item to each agenda that allows for the Board to potentially cancel the following meeting
- Revise the Bylaws to ensure that that Library Board schedules no less than 6 meetings a year.
- Revise the Bylaws to ensure that the Library Board schedules no less than 9 meetings a year.

**For any decisions that decrease the number of meeting added into the Bylaws, the Library believes these months listed below would be required months in which the Library Board would be scheduled to meet.

Proposed Month Meeting Schedule:

February (Quarterly Oct-Dec and/or possible retreat)
March (Budget Presentation)
May (Quarterly Jan-Mar)
July (By-laws Elect Officers)
September (Quarterly Apr-Jun)

November (Quarterly July-Sept)

Additional discussion may include retaining the standard meeting day and time for the meeting schedule selected from the above options which is currently the 3rd Wednesday of the month starting at 4:00 pm. The Library recommends keeping the meetings scheduled for the 3rd Wednesday of the month but is open to starting earlier if meetings continue to exceed an hour.

Recommendation and Suggested Motion: That the Board discuss ideas and provide direction for any verbiage revisions to the Library Board of Trustee Bylaws to be effective July 1, 2019. If the Board is unable to select an option, the recommendation would be that the Board table this discussion for a future agenda item.











Early Literacy: S.T.E.A.M






After consolidating staff into one workroom, we eliminated stand alone desks and used branch gift funds to install counters for workstations. Resulting in....







Background: The Library Board of Trustees receives regular monthly updates regarding the status of expenditures from the Tacchino Trust bequeathment to the Washoe County Library System.

Expenditures for the month of March 2019 included: \$0.00 for Downtown Reno and \$10,922.15 for Downtown Reno Library Children's Materials.

To date, Tacchino Trust funds has expended a total of \$238,925.91 with \$25,343.99 of those funds spent on Children's Materials.

The total Tacchino Trust funds available the beginning of April 2019 is \$673,327.09 (includes available balance of RN Children's Materials allotment of \$74,656.01, information which was not included in the March report)



20 Ways to Raise a Book-Smart Baby

Early Literacy Experiences for Babies and Toddlers

- Read to your child daily from birth on. Read several times during the day, even if it's for just a few minutes at a time.
- When your baby begins to handle his own books, give him board books with heavy pages, rounded edges, and uncluttered pictures. Around 12 months, share lift-the-flap books for peekaboo experiences. When toddlers are ready, choose books with paper pages and just one or two sentences per page.
- Invite your toddler to help pick out books. And yes, it's good to read her favorites over and over again, as she will begin to recognize words.
- Talk about the pictures—both illustrations and photographs. Ask simple "what" questions, point to words occasionally, and eventually let your child help turn pages.
- Do not attempt to teach your child to read. (No drilling or memorizing!) Your reading experiences together should always be fun.
- When your baby makes sounds, imitate them. After repeating his sounds a few times, make new sounds for him to imitate.
- Talk to your child during everyday activities and daily routines. Introduce new and unusual words to her.
- Provide experiences that allow you to introduce new words to your child. For example, at the zoo or on a farm you can introduce animal names and sounds; on a nature walk, introduce plant and insect names.
- When you are at a store, the post office, a restaurant, or any other public place, point to words on the signs that are everywhere and read them to your child.
- Read, sing, and chant nursery rhymes with your child. Make up motions to go with the rhymes.

- Share lap rhymes, finger and hand rhymes, toe and foot rhymes, and bounce rhymes daily. Examples are "Where Is Thumbkin?' and "This Little Piggy." If you don't know any, you can always make them up. Your child will love the interaction.
- Sing songs with your child every day. And don't worry about singing in tune—your child doesn't care!
- Sing songs slowly so that your child can hear the different sounds that make up each word. In children's songs, there is a distinct note for every syllable in a word, making it easier to hear those sounds.
- Ing songs that are silly and that play with language, such as "This Old Man," "Hickory Dickory Dock," "Skinnamarink" (also called "Skidamarink"), and "Three Little Fishies." Make up new songs, and sing them to familiar tunes. Add motions or act out songs.
- Share all kinds of music styles with your child, and let him play simple instruments, such as wrist bells, shakers, rattles, or maracas.
- Share stories with your child. Tell her stories about your family, stories about things that have happened during the day, and even made-up stories about her favorite toys or stuffed animals.
- Share wordless books with your child, telling the story from the pictures (a young toddler can help). You can also use a photograph as the inspiration for any story.
- Turn off the TV, and play with your child every day. The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends no television for children younger than two years.
- Provide play materials and experiences that encourage the imagination, such as water play, sand play, play dough or modeling clay activities, painting, blowing bubbles, scribbling with large crayons, and pretend play.
- When grandparents, relatives, or friends ask for gift suggestions for birthdays and other occasions, recommend books!

- Cuando su bebé empiece a manejar sus propios libros, bríndele libros de tapa dura con hojas gruesas, bordes redondeados, y dibujos ordenados. Para los niños pequeños, cuando estén listos, elija libros con hojas de papel y sólo una o dos oraciones por página.
- Invite a su niño pequeño a que lo ayude a elegir los libros. Y sí, está bien leerles sus favoritos una y otra vez, así es como empezará a reconocer las palabras.
- Hable sobre los dibujos tanto las ilustraciones como las fotografías. Haga preguntas simples sobre "qué es", señale palabras ocasionalmente, y eventualmente permita que su hijo lo ayude a cambiar de página.
- No trate de enseñarle a su hijo cómo leer. (¡Nada de forzar o memorizar!). Sus experiencias de lectura juntos deben ser siempre divertidas.

- Ouando está en una tienda, oficina de correo, un restaurant, o en cualquier otro lugar público, señale las palabras en las señales que están en todos lados y léalas en voz alta para su hijo.

- Lea, cante y entone canciones infantiles con su hijo. Invente movimientos que vayan con las canciones.
- Comparta rimas con baile, rimas con manos y dedos, rimas con pies, rimas con saltos todos los días. Ejemplos de esto son "¿Dónde Está Thumbkin?" y "Este Pequeño Chanchito". Si no conoce ninguno, siempre puede inventarlo. A su hijo le encantará la interacción.
- Cante canciones con su hijo todos los días. Y no se preocupe sobre la entonación ¡a su hijo no le importa!
- Cante canciones despacio para que su hijo pueda escuchar los diferentes sonidos que conforman cada palabra. En las canciones infantiles, hay una nota distintiva para cada sílaba de la palabra, lo que facilita escuchar esos sonidos.
- Cante canciones que son simples y que juegan con el lenguaje, como "Este Hombre Viejo", "Hickory Dickory Dock", "Skinnamarink" (también conocido como "Skidamarink"), y "Tres Pequeños Pececitos." Invente nuevas canciones, y cántelas con ritmos familiares. Agregue movimiento o actúe las canciones.
- Comparta todo tipo de ritmos con su hijo, y deje que juegue con instrumentos simples, como cascabeles, sonajeros o maracas.
- Comparta historias con su hijo. Cuéntele historias sobre su familia, historias sobre cosas que pasaron durante el día, y también invente historias sobre sus juguetes favoritos o peluches.
- Comparta libros sin palabras con su hijos, contándole la historia desde los dibujos (un niño pequeño puede ayudar). También puede utilizar una fotografía como inspiración para cualquier historia.
- Apague la tele, y juegue con su hijo todos los días. La Academia Americana de Pediatría recomienda que no haya televisión para los niños menores de dos años.
- Bríndele material de juego y experiencias que lo alienten a la imaginación, como juegos con agua, juegos con arena, masa para jugar o actividades de modelado con arcilla, pintura, soplar burbujas, garabatos con crayones y juegos de simulación.
- Cuando los abuelos, parientes o amigos pregunten por ideas para regalos para cumpleaños u otras ocasiones, ¡recomiende libros!




