2013 Library Highlights

- Offered basic and intermediate computer classes; expanded the number of classes in response to demand.
- Offered E-Book Cafés with one-on-one assistance for mobile device users.
- Added a **new web page devoted to job seekers**: www.washoecountylibrary.us/jobs.html
- **Volunteers donated 14,304 hours** in calendar year 2012.
- Nearly **30,000 people voted at a library** (Early Voting and Election Day).
- Nearly **2,500 individuals and families filed their taxes at their local library**, through partnerships with IRS Certified Volunteer Preparers from AARP and the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance programs.
- The Library System donated more than 6,200 books (discards and patron donations) to local schools and agencies this past year, including Corbett Elementary School, Swope Middle School, Wooster and Damonte Ranch High Schools, Washoe County School District Reengagement Center, and the Boys and Girls Club.
- The Downtown Reno Library was added to the National Register of Historic Places.
